Donald Gene Hoover, 85, of Dunlap, formerly of Glen Burnie, MD, died at his home Saturday, March 19, 2016 after a short illness. Mr. Hoover was a member of Morganville church of Christ, Whitwell, TN.

He was born and raised in Ann Arundel County, Maryland, a veteran of the United States Army and was a retired heavy equipment operator. He was fondly known as "Track-turner" by family and friends, a CB handle he earned early on because of his profession. In 1991 he moved to his wife's hometown of Dunlap. Having previously been Maryland's youngest Lieutenant Volunteer Firefighter at age 19, he was instrumental in helping begin Southend Volunteer Fire Dept. for the Daus community. One of his many notable accomplishments there was obtaining full turn-out gear for the whole department from his Maryland contacts, and was proud to serve as Chief for one term.

Mr. Hoover was preceded in death by his parents, Theodore and Mable Smith Hoover, brothers, Theodore, Jr., Louis, Vernon and William, sister, Mable Hoover Phebus.
